# **GWENNAP TELEPHONE BOX**

When we moved to Gwennap we discovered this telephone box had for some time been devoid of its telephone. My grandson saw a notice inside indicating that it could be acquired by a responsible organisation for a nominal fee. It seemed a pity that this landmark might be removed. We discovered that a large number of these boxes including this one had been purchased by a company for potential use of community defibrillators, or other similar projects.

We approached the parish council to enquire if they would support the conversion to a Book Exchange. The Church Hall in Gwennap had a collection of books which could be suitable, but there was an issue of accessibility. The parish council agreed to support the idea of the Book Exchange as the proposed defibrillator location was to be placed in the lobby of the Church Hall. A number of residents in the Village were supportive of the Book Exchange idea as was the parish council who also kindly proposed that a small amount of money would be available to support the conversion.

Work commenced and the books were installed in time for the Gwennap Street Market in May. The concept is that you take a book and exchange it for another, There is no financial transaction: it is open 24/7, With illumination kindly supplied by BT.

We hope that books suitable for all ages will be available, So, as with most things in life, "use it or Lose it"!



# Cusgarne CP School News

The school has enjoyed a busy half term since Easter. We have welcomed some new families to our community


and our numbers are thriving as the school continues to go from strength to strength.

Children in Class 1 have been enthralled by Tim Peake's international space station adventure, and in particular his recent achievement of running a marathon in space. This inspired then to

do their own Mini Marathon in space (aka the school field). Every child was set the challenge of making a space helmet at

home; while in class they made space backpacks and trained hard for their 26.2 m (metre) run! The space helmets were





The whole school has been engaged with science and discovery. The children in Class 2 have been growing vegetables and last week were able to plant their seedlings out in our new raised beds on the lower playing field. They have also been out bug hunting for mini

beasts in the local area and all the children came back excited about the discoveries they had made.

Meanwhile Class 3 visited the Bissoe Nature Reserve on a wonderful walk from school. They did however come across a slight problem while trying to reach the pond-dipping site, where an area of the path was flooded. The

intrepid adventurers weren't going to let this beat them and swiftly built a bridge across in order to get everyone across (I believe it's still in suitable repair and still being used!). The pond dipping was very successful and children returned to school buzzing with excitement about the range of pond life they had found, as well as rather wet, muddy and exhausted!


Eight of our children recently represented Cusgarne at an athletics competition, Quad Kids, at Carn Brea athletics arena. 39 schools took part in the event, with over 300 children competing. Our pupils performed brilliantly and were pushing themselves to achieve their best in the four events: standing long jump, vortex throw, 75m sprint and 600m run. Our team finished 18<sup>th</sup> for which they can be very proud.



Our annual sports day, which was held at both the Richard Jory Playing Field in the morning, and our school field in the afternoon, went without a hitch and the weather was kind to us. The children all competed and the crowning champions were Team Vickery – congratulations to them!

# 1() SUE'S RECIPE





# PORK IN CORNISH CIDER CASSEROLE (Serves 6)

I have been making this casserole for years and always think of it more as a summer casserole than a winter one. Strictly speaking a casserole is a dish cooked in the oven and then served in the same dish but that definition has widened to include a one-dish meal cooked on the top of the stove. You can use almost any pork but I like boneless loin steaks as they require minimal preparation other than the cutting up. I am not mad on green peppers but they work well in this recipe. The difficult part is deciding which Cornish cider you are going to use!

2 medium onions, sliced
4 carrots, peeled and sliced
2 green peppers, sliced
225g/8oz chestnut mushrooms, sliced
4 tbsp olive oil
900g/2lb lean pork, cut into 3cm/1inch cubes
Flour – to coat pork cubes
Mixed herbs including sage (fresh or dried)
570ml/1pt Cornish cider (I prefer dry to sweet)
Salt
Freshly ground black pepper
300ml / ½pt soured cream



Large flameproof casserole with close fitting lid

Put the oil into the casserole dish and heat. Add the onions, carrots and peppers. Cook until they are soft.

Take off heat. Add the mushrooms and toss to combine with the vegetables.

Season the flour with the salt, pepper and mixed herbs – go easy on the sage as it can overpower the flavour of the casserole. Toss the cubes of pork in the seasoned flour until they are completely covered.

Add the pork to the casserole dish and discard any leftover flour. Mix everything really well. Return to the heat.

Pour in the cider, stirring well. This is the part that I really look forward to as the smell is just delicious.

Put the lid on the casserole and return to top of the stove on a gentle simmer. Your kitchen will start to smell wonderful as the casserole cooks. Simmer on a very low heat for about 50 minutes to an hour until the meat is tender. Stir occasionally to prevent the flour sticking to the base. Remove from the heat and allow to cool a little before stirring in the soured cream.

Taste and adjust seasoning as necessary.

Serve with baked potatoes or a wide ribbon egg pasta such as pappardelle. I never feel the need for side vegetables as they are already in the dish.





- Outside the front of the Cornish Arms Frogpool
- In the entrance porch of the Church Hall Gwennap
- In the porch of Crofthandy Village Hall

All three are now commissioned and working. Their position is now known by South West Ambulance Service.

The cabinets are unlocked **BUT ALARMED!** They open by gripping the handles on each side at the top and pulling towards you. The front cover will then hinge downwards.

I will be making regular inspections to check on the condition of each site, but if you notice any problem, my contact details are on the outside of each cabinet.

So far, we have 56 trained volunteers with about another 10 awaiting training. There have been various delays along the way. Our supplier had to change his equipment source following his review of the latest types of defibrillator. We now have the most up to date model with enhanced features. Ongoing costs have also been reduced. As the operation of the defibrillator. Is the same in all models, there is no problem for users.

After a somewhat shaky start, I would like to thank all who have volunteered for training, those who provided suitable sites and the efforts of all who made this worthwhile community project a success. This is one of those situations where you prepare for the unexpected, and hope it never happens.

# GWENNAP PARISH COUNCIL A HISTORY Pt. I

# **GWENNAP PARISH COUNCIL How it all began back in 1894**

This account, dated October 1931, comes from a small Standing Orders booklet produced by the Parish Council in February 1957. The Chairman at the time was Richard Jory)

At the Parish Meeting held at St. Day on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September 1894 it was resolved to establish a Parish Council for the civil parish of Gwennap and a Statutory Meeting was held on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 1894 following, at which 22 candidates were nominated for the fifteen seats and fifteen members of the Council duly elected.

The Council pursuant to the powers vested in them elected a Chairman who was not a member of the Council

The said Parish Council on entering into office took over from the old Parish Vestry the Tithe apportionment map for the Parish and the block plan of the Cemetery situated at Churchtown Gwennap but no other papers or documents of any interest or value.

The Parish Council also took over from the Vestry

• The Freehold Farm known as Trebost or Treboast situate in the Parish of Stithians and containing about 19.279 acres of land.

On entering into possession the Council found the farm had been let as an off farm practically derelict. Some four cottages on the north-eastern side of the farm had been allowed to fall into ruin, the dwelling-house was partly ruins and the roof had been allowed to fall in whilst the cattle houses had been also allowed to become absolutely useless.

The rental was then £32 per annum.

After a dispute with the Charity Commissioners, who eventually withdrew all claims, since the 12<sup>th</sup> May 1898 the farm remains in the undisputed possession of the Parish Council who have appropriated the income to such purposes as they saw fit. The farm was eventually let and the proceeds received and stored until an amount sufficient to build a new dwelling-house and farm buildings was collected, which was accordingly done. The tenement

now consists of a good dwelling-house and cattle house in good repair with sufficient gates and appliances for all purposes and is let for a term of 21 years at the annual rent of £47.

•On taking over the property of the Old Vestry Meeting the Council acquired the present (1931 remember!) Council room and stable and warehouse as at present occupied by them together with the right of way to and from their premises over the roadway in front of the property which is known as the Old Workhouse. This property consists of the Council room – a one storied 30 feet in length and 18 feet in width and the Lobby or waiting room 8 feet in depth and extending the whole width of the Council Chamber, a stable and warehouse (with closet) recently erected.

(Seems the property described was at Burnwithian, St. Day)

- The Cemetery at the Churchtown in this parish containing about two acres of land and more particularly defined in the ground plan now in the possession of the Council is enclosed and levelled.
- A piece of ground in front of and adjoining the Town clock at St. Day on which has been erected a Memorial to those who served in the War was offered to and accepted by the Council and the necessary documents vesting the same are in possession of the Council.

In the Council room are kept the Tithe apportionment map, a set of ordnance survey maps for the Parish and the ground plan for the Cemetery, the Table of Burial Fees, a safe containing the minute and other books and documents.

The Council are Trustees of St. Day Town Clock for the upkeep of which £200 is invested in Consols.




