PARISHIONERS' DISCUSSION

P.C. Wheeler reported that 15 crimes involving criminal damage, car burning, assault and vehicle theft had been reported together with 45 incidents. The majority related in some way to the occupants of Wheal Jewel and it was suggested that PC Wheeler arrange a meeting between the police, social services, the County Council and the Site Manager to try and resolve this situation.

He had discussed the question of speeding at Crofthandy and had nothing further to add to the correspondence received. He pointed out that there were 400 requests in Cornwall last month and the Police only have access to 2 Minute Man units (which indicate whether or not there is a speeding problem to be addressed)

Prayers were said and the January 2002 Minutes were signed as correct.

Normally the Council should call a public meeting (probably 2/3 in our case) where the parishioners can air their views and from this a working party should be formed to lead the procedure. This procedure can be through a properly designed survey preferably hand delivered to every household and collects back on an agreed date. A file of papers was left for the Councillors to review and in the

meantime the Clerk was to look at the making of the formal claim for a grant and check if the guidance notes were to hand.
